Navigating Grammar at Different CEFR Levels

CEFR Level A1: Beginner

Focus: Basic grammar necessary for very simple interactions.

- 1. Nouns and Articles
- I have a cat.
- She bought some apples.
- Can you pass me the book on the table?
- 2. Present Simple
- He goes to school every day.
- They like to play football.
- She does not (doesn't) know the answer.
- 3. Prepositions of Place and Time
- She is at the park.
- The meeting is at 3 PM.
- We have a holiday in December.
- 4. Questions and Negatives
- Does she like coffee?
- Where do they visit in Paris?
- He does not (doesn't) watch TV.

CEFR Level A2: Elementary

Focus: Grammar for simple sentences and frequently used expressions.

- 1. Past Simple
- She visited her grandparents last weekend.
- They went to the cinema yesterday.
- He did not (didn't) see the movie.
- 2. Modal Verbs
- You should eat more vegetables.
- We must finish this project by tomorrow.
- Can I use your phone?
- 3. Comparatives and Superlatives
- This book is more interesting than that one.
- She is the tallest girl in the class.
- This car is faster than my old one.
- 4. Phrasal Verbs
- give up: a) to stop trying
- look after: b) to take care of
- take off: c) to remove



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CEFR Lewvel B1: Intermediate

Focus: Expanding grammar knowledge for expressing a broader range of situations.

- **1. Present Continuous**
- He is reading a book.
- They are planning a trip.
- She is not (isn't) working today.
- 2. Past Continuous
- I was watching TV when you called.
- They were playing football all afternoon.
- · She was not (wasn't) sleeping when we arrived.
- 3. Future Forms
- · I am meeting my friend tomorrow.
- She will probably pass the exam.
- We are going to the beach next weekend.
- 4. Conditionals: Zero and First Conditionals
- If you heat water to 100°C, it boils.
- If it rains tomorrow, we will stay at home.
- Plants die if they do not (don't) get enough water.

CEFR Level B2: Upper-Intermediate

Focus: Complex grammar for discussing varied topics and expressing viewpoints.

1. Modal Verbs: Expanded Range

- She could come to the party if she finishes work early.
- We might go to the concert, but we're not sure yet.
- If I were you, I would talk to him about it.
- 2. Passive Voice
- The bridge was built in 2005.
- My bike has been stolen.
- A new product will be launched by the company next month.
- 3. Narrative Tenses
- When I arrived at the party, everyone had already started eating. They were dancing when I saw them.
- 4. Second Conditional
- If I were you, I would not (wouldn't) take that job.
- If they had more time, they would travel more often.
- She would buy a new car if she had enough money.

CEFR Level C1: Advanced

Focus: Mastery of complex structures and subtleties in the language.

- 1. Third Conditional
- If he had studied harder, he would have passed the exam.
- We would have gone to the beach if the weather had been better.
- She would not have missed the flight if she had left earlier.
- 2. Mixed Conditionals
- If I were more careful, I would not (wouldn't) have this problem now.
- If they had saved money, they would have bought a house by now.
- She would be happier if she had followed her dreams.
- 3. Advanced Passive
- It is believed that he is a great artist.
- The new law is expected to be passed soon.
- A new species has been discovered by scientists.
- 4. Subjunctive and Wish Clauses
- I wish I knew the answer.
- If only she were here to see this.
- · It's important that he attend
